ORDER FOR JUDGMENT

The above-entitled case came on for a hearing before the undersigned Judge of District Court on December 30, 2009, on Defendants' motion for summary judgment. The motion for summary judgment was granted in favor of the Defendants by Order of this Court on January 29, 2010. This Court did not explicitly address the aiding and abetting claim asserted by Plaintiff against Defendant Vladimir Kazaryan in its January 29, 2010 Order. However, the parties in this matter have agreed that because this Court's Summary Judgment Order left no underlying claim to aid and abet, this claim is no longer viable and should also be dismissed on summary judgment. Both parties have also requested that judgment be entered in accordance with Rule 58.01 of the Minnesota Rules of Civil Procedure.


Based upon all the files, records, and proceedings herein, including the arguments and stipulations of counsel, the Court makes the following **ORDER**:
